### Chairman's Report 2026

This year saw us reach a full council for the first time since April 2024.

Several projects have been completed this year including the completion of the parish LED street light upgrade, a marked improvement to the condition of footpath between Aislaby and Wrelton, a full repair of the footsteps near the Wrelton village hall and playground, repair of the footpath stiles and purchase of an additional waste bin for Wrelton.

Considerable work on road safety projects has taken place this year. Barriers have been installed on Marton lane around open gutters near the road. The main road safety project has been the purchase and installation of the vehicle activated sign on the A170 which can be used in both Aislaby and Middleton. Unfortunately other ideas raised in the safer spaces campaign could not be progressed due to funding issues, however we continue to pursue improvements where possible.

The council has continued to provide assistance through the grant scheme for defibrillator maintenance in Wrelton, Wrelton playground maintenance and Village green maintenance. All done with just an inflationary rise in the parish precept.
